Message from Pastor Kerry . . .

As you can see from the front page of the newsletter my installation service on March 6 was a wonderful day of worship and celebration. I am still filled with gratitude for the participation and presence of all the wonderful folks from CCU, our ecumenical friends, our General Presbyter Linda Culbertson, and our Co-Regional Ministers the Deweys. I want to thank everyone who helped make it a great day for me, but, even more, a great day for CCU.

An installation service is definitely a mountain top moment. It's important to have mountain top moments; those moments of celebration, of blessing, encouragement, of being uplifted and inspired. These are moments that fulfill us, that fill us with hope, and hopefully sustain us in the more mundane and regular moments. These are moments we mark, we take note of, we remember.

The lectionary does something interesting just before the season of Lent. In the Sunday or two before Lent we usually have Ascension Sunday or Transfiguration Sunday. This year it was Transfiguration Sunday. These were both "mountain top" moments for Jesus and his followers. In his transfiguration Jesus is transformed, dazzling and shining before the disciples, and the two great prophets of the faith, Moses and Elijah appear with him. As if that weren't enough, they hear God's voice saying, "This is my Son, the Beloved; with him I am well pleased; listen to him!" Peter wants to build tabernacles and stay there on the mountain top it's such a powerful and moving experience. But they must leave the mountain top and move on to do the work of preaching, teaching, and healing. As they travel with Jesus there will be other moments, perhaps not as dramatic but still powerful.

In the church year we move from one mountain top moment to the next, from Christmas to Easter to Pentecost. And we love those great, high holy moments of the liturgical year. But most of life happens in between. Most of faith and ministry happens in the day to day, moving from one "ordinary" Sunday to the next. If every Sunday were a mountain top experience, we would be exhausted! If every Sunday were Christmas or Easter, we might enjoy it for a time, but like Peter we learn we can't dwell on the mountain top. The 40 days of Lent remind us that on our journey to the summits, we also pass through valley and desert. As we struggle to deny ourselves and take up the cross in a more intentional way, we are reminded that we can't get to Easter without Good Friday. We're reminded

Earth Care Congregation Certification Awarded CCU

The Presbyterian Church (USA) Environmental Ministries certified CCU as an Earth Care Congregation on March 15.

According to the press release prepared by Katie Holmes of Environmental Ministries, "This honor speaks to the great commitment that Christ Church Uniting Disciples & Presbyterians has to caring for God's earth."

The ECC program was begun in 2010 with a goal of inspiring churches "to care for God's earth in a holistic way, through integrating earth care into all of their church life. The Earth Care Congregation certification honors churches that make that commitment and encourages others to follow their example."

CCU became the 24th church in the U.S. to be certified as an ECC—and was the first in Hawaii. We received a



certificate, and a copy of the book, 50 Ways to Help Save the Earth: How You and Your Church Can Make a Difference by Rebecca Barnes-Davies, for our library. Please feel free to borrow this book from the Environmental Stewardship section of the CCU library. We also now may use the ECC seal on our website, newsletter, bulletin, or other materials to promote our commitment to earth care. We will need to apply for re-certification in one year.

Thanks to all our CCU-ers who each year help us become a little deeper shade of green. From our "CCU Thinks Green" shopping bags to the Solar Energy Fair, earth-care-focused Adult Study series, guest speakers, recycling, water in pitchers instead of plastic, Earth Day celebrations, National Preach-In on Global Warming services and "Love the Earth" valentines, slideshows & songs, prayers, hymns, seedling give-aways, educational displays ... to our photo voltaic exploration meetings last year, we continue to improve our efforts to "till and keep" the garden. This year already Gerry Madison has transitioned us to Fair Trade coffee and tea and John Heidel has started our HI-5 recycling program to benefit children at IHS. These two initiatives clearly demonstrate the close link between social justice and environmental justice.

Since its earliest days CCU's music has been a vital part of church life. Our musicians have been—and are—widely talented, both vocalists and instrumentalists. Whether singers or ringers, woodwind, keyboard, brass, string, or percussion artists they have given us hours, days & years of joyful worship—plus a wide variety of other tuneful experiences.

We are truly blessed in having an unusually talented organist/pianist in Kalua Tataipu. On weekdays Kalua is on the music faculty at Kamehameha Schools. CCU director of music "par excellence" Wayne "Doc" Wilson also is a weekday music faculty member but at Kapolei's Island Pacific Academy. Doc also sings in several community choral groups, including the Honolulu Vocal Arts Ensemble and a new Kapolei chorus.

CCU singers have also added their voices to island chorales such as Honolulu Opera Chorus, Windward Choral Society, Honolulu Chorale, and Lanikai Players. These include Paul Belanger, Dianne Brookins, Clancy Lyman, Chandra Peters, John & Marian Heidel, Peggy Haring, Wanda Nichols, & George Wyman.

Many of CCU's "lighter" entertainment events such as "Radio Daze" or the fall stewardship finale feature such musical favorites as Bill & Jane Muench's piano & clarinet duo and the vocal trio of Donna (Bean), Marian (Heidel), & Jane. Vocalist Melody Heidel does "popular" solos also. And remember Kalia Medeiros singing "Unwritten" by Natasha Bedingfield on Pastor Kerry's first Sunday as CCU Pastor, January 2, 2011.

Among more unusual talents are those of Rollo Scheurenbrand & Keith Zeilinger, both of whom create Hawaiian ukuleles, & Rollo also works with koa & other beautiful woods to create guitars.

Talented folks who bring us a wonderful variety of musical experiences are skilled uke & guitar players Lauren Medeiros & aforementioned Doc. Also John Stiles' trumpet & Bill Muench's clarinet bring us special anthem music. Marianne Whiting & Estelle Codier even brought us harp melodies not long ago. The DOC portion of the Easter special offering will support Week of Compassion whose theme this year is "Sharing Brings Joy."

Week of Compassion provides immediate assistance and relief for those affected by natural disasters such as the earthquakes in Haiti and most recently in Japan. Week of Compassion also works with other partners to provide support for refugees, and helps provide essential components for long term, self sustaining futures for people in vulnerable areas, both in the U.S. and around the world.



How is Week of Compassion related to One Great Hour of Sharing? WOC is uniquely Disciple but also inherently ecumenical. Fifty years ago, during World War II and immediately following, Protestant churches made appeals for relief and reconstruction. In 1946, Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill, newly-elected Presiding Bishop of the Episcopal Church, set a goal of one million dollars per year for world relief. On nationwide radio, he challenged members to raise "one million dollars in one hour." His impassioned challenge worked. In 1949, church leaders from several denominations formed a committee to organize an appeal aimed at supporting the separate campaigns of American churches. While the post-war language seems a bit stilted, their joint statement in support of this effort is still remarkably contemporary: "This nationwide united effort by America's Christians has an importance far beyond the practical goal of fund raising. For this great joint program will not only strengthen the vitally important relief and rehabilitation work of the churches overseas, but will also prove to all the world how great is the power generated when Christians unite in a common cause." Major networks and independent stations carried the program on Saturday, March 26. The broadcast, called "One Great Hour," closed with a request that listeners attend their local church the following morning and make a sacrificial contribution.

In 1950, the name was changed to One Great Hour of Sharing. Thus, from the beginning, this has been an ecumenical effort. As denominations changed and merged, One Great Hour of Sharing has varied from eight to twenty-nine participating communions. Currently, the OGHS com-



About Presbyterians

During the Lenten season Presbyterians are asked to participate in One Great Hour of Sharing. OGHS began over 60 years ago in response to the devastation of WW II. Every since, the funds raised have been used in response to disasters & needs around the world. Presbyterian offerings are shared 36 percent to hunger needs and 32 percent to both disaster aid and to development of people (who are living in poverty).



OGHS funds from Disaster Assistance and the Hunger Program this year were used in Haiti following the January 2010 earthquake. Within 24 hours of the quake, funds were used to set up 15 food & water stations, materials for shelters provided, & 35,000 hygiene kits distributed. In the months following, OGHS continued to provide help including medical aids & clean water projects.

Another area where OGHS responded this year was Pakistan which experienced the worst floods (one-third of the country) in its history last summer—2 million homes gone, 10 million people homeless. OGHS provided food, temporary shelters & health units, plus medical services & medicines to prevent epidemics among the displaced homeless.

These are only two of the instances of OGHS response to a multitude of needs in so many parts of our world. You will be reminded in coming Sundays of other areas of need—and of how very "far and wide: our sharing can help others.

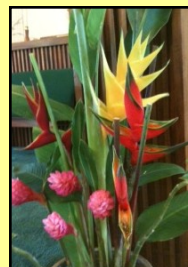
